Eric Deaton launches U.S. Senate campaign as an Independent Candidate

DAYTON OHIO - Southwestern Ohio area resident and Electrical Engineer, Eric Deaton has launched his 2010 campaign for the U.S. Senate seat being vacated by the retiring George Voinovich.
